

If you witness someone being detained by ICE

- Do not interfere or escalate the situation; don't touch, push or hit an officer, do not run away (if you have to leave, walk calmly)
- Record video of the interaction
- Remind the victims that they can remain silent, they don't have to answer questions, they have the right to call a lawyer & they don't have to sign anything without a lawyer
- Record any identifying information, like agency vests, badge numbers, car make and model or car license plates
- If officers ask you to step back, do so, but you can keep recording video. You have a First Amendment right to record law enforcement actions in public spaces
- Try to get the name of the person being detained, and a family or emergency contact and phone number, so that you can call them to let them know that their friend/relative has been detained
- Write down everything you remember about what you witnessed
- Get contact information and copies of any recordings or photos from other witnesses
